

## Guideline: Dealer Signage

All dealers who sell beverages in deposit beverage containers shall place a sign at the primary entrance to the dealer's place of business. In accordance with Chapter 342G, Section 113, Hawaii Revised Statutes.

- A template of a sign is provided on the Department of Health (DOH) website at: [www.hawaii.gov/doh](http://www.hawaii.gov/doh). Print out and use the DOH template or create your own.
- The law requires the following information be provided: name, address, and operating hours of the nearest certified redemption center.
- DOH recommends that the sign size be large enough for customers to easily see and read.
- You may add other items, for example, directions to help customers find the redemption center.
- To find out where the nearest certified redemption center is check the DOH website for a map of redemption centers. DOH recommends checking the map regularly for updates. Recyclers are currently working to obtain sites for centers and will likely complete the certification process through DOH close to the January start date.
